

CCB Selects New Engineers

After the completion of the Apron Rehabilitation Project, CCB requested Statements of Qualifications for a new firm that can provide engineering services as well as other special services related to the Airport's Capital Improvement Program.

In July, CCB selected Mead and Hunt. This group, which has an office in Ontario, has vast knowledge of GA airports and their impressive list of nationwide clients include the likes of Riverside Municipal Airport, French Valley, and Big Bear. Mead and Hunt impressed CCB management with its experience and knowledge particularly in matters of knowing the requirements needed to interface with the FAA.

First tasks to be completed will be to update the Airport's five-year Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP) which is submitted to the FAA annually. Some of the tasks that will take priority are the second phase of the Apron Rehabilitation Project that will provide new asphalt on the ramp from the western boundary of the project recently completed over to the seven-sided building. Another task that will be in the ACIP is an update to the Airport's Master Plan which was last updated in 2012. Additionally, a project that will be listed that has a high priority is an upgrade to CCB's runway lighting system. The goal of this project is to switch all runway lights, including the beacon, to LED for visibility and energy savings.

With a few exceptions, Mead and Hunt will not be used to plan and construct the 15,000 square foot hangar earmarked to go on the pad created from the last project. They will be used, however, to design the planned parking to go with that project.



2021 Fireworks Show - Run It Back?

This was due to the City of Upland choosing to provide a "stay-in-place" event with the premise of allowing residents to be able to see the fireworks display from the comfort of their own yards.

Since the Holliday Rock family agreed to allow the City to use their site to launch the fireworks, it instantly made Cable Airport THE spot to watch the display; unfortunately, CCB was not open to the general public which caused them to find a location around the Airport if they wanted a better view.

Based on how the day went, CCB staff sensed that could be an opportunity to revive an airport-wide event similar to what we had with the Air Shows. After the event, CCB engaged the City in a preliminary discussion about the possibility of future displays being held in the same location. From the feedback, there is an interest from all parties of doing so again.

Initial thoughts would be to turn the 4th of July into a fly-in opening the gates to the public and hosting them during the day and for the fireworks display.

As of now, the City and CCB are researching aspects of such an event such as parking, crowd control, etc. As details emerge, more information will follow.
