

DC Flight Simulation NOW OPEN!!!

Happy holidays from **DC Flight Simulation**! December 1, 2023 will mark the official opening for the business. The old hangar doors on Hex 5 are coming down and we look forward to an exciting future in the advancement and promotion of general aviation here at KCCB. The simulator facility is now fully operational. We are located in the seven sided hangar just west of the cafe.

The simulator facility was designed to be unmanned and accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There will be an on-boarding process that will grant graduated levels of after hours access. We've added a GPS component to each of our simulators that will allow you to use your ForeFlight app and treat your simulator session the same as an actual flight. We are also setting up the ability to have live ATC integrated into your simulator sessions. Our current rates are as follows: \$100.00 per hour, or \$490.00 for 25 hours within a 30 day period, which comes out to just under \$20.00 per hour for AATD simulator time.

The facility is a "bring your own CFI" facility, where all are welcome. We do have a presence on the airfield most days or you can reach us by phone at (909) 284-8900. Our website will be available shortly. All scheduling and billing can be done using our Flight Circle software. We will need your contact information to set up an account and get you on-boarded. We love showing off the facility so don't hesitate to stop by for a visit or call to schedule a demo.

Question of the Month

Before an early morning flight, when the overnight air temperature has been below freezing, no water is found in the fuel during the preflight inspection. After landing some hours later after a flight in clear, sunny, VFR conditions, with air temperature now in the 50s, a check of the fuel finds it is contaminated with water. Where did the water likely come from? Why did the pilot miss the contamination on the early morning preflight? (*Keep reading for the answer below*!)

Question of the Month – Answer

The likely scenario is that the water was frozen solid during the early morning contamination check, and so it was not detected. During the flight, the temperatures rose, and the ice thawed, thus presenting as water contamination in the fuel after landing.


