


Gone west...

Hangar Space Still in High Demand!

CCB has a number of active pilots with active aircraft waiting for an enclosed hangar. And the only people put on the list are ones that are already renting space on the field.

With hangars here at CCB continuing to be in high demand and with the continuous flow of inquiries from pilots and/ or aircraft owners that desire to be here, we would like to remind you that if we determine that your hangar is NOT being used for <u>active</u> aviation purposes you will be asked to vacate your hangar and leave the Airport. The only way CCB survives being a general aviation airport is to be an airport not a storage facility and we refuse jeopardize its FAA funding by not complying with the Federal Aviation Administration's Policy on the Non-Aeronautical Use of Airport Hangars... a policy that focuses specifically on the use of hangars at an airport that receives federal funds.

The Cable family promotes general aviation and desires the industry to thrive thus Airport management will take the necessary steps to abide by the policies set by the FAA. Thank you for your cooperation!

2021 Capital Improvement Project Plans

After taking almost a year, last December, Cable Airport received its final close-out approval on the recently competed apron project to the east of the main parking lot. The delay was caused primarily by the pandemic. And due to the pandemic, planning for future capital improvements at CCB have come to a standstill. While this delay may appear to be negative, it is actually quite positive as the delay has allowed CCB to receive permission from the FAA to switch engineering firms and re-prioritize its list of future capital improvement projects. FAA projects being considered for the near future include the second phase of the apron project recently completed, the installation LED runway lighting, and the beginning of the design of new box hangars to go where the shade hangars currently reside.

Projects not utilizing FAA funding that will hopefully launch in 2021 include another asphalt repair project (location yet to be determined), beginning the process to get approval to build the large hangar that will reside on the pad created in the last capital improvement project, and the beginning of the planning and design process needed to build one or two large hangars on the land north of the fuel island. Detail will follow as they develop.

Crazy weather to start 2021

It was as if 2020 wasn't bad enough, 2021 doesn't appear to be doing any better... yet! COVID-19 rages on and the weather has been all over the place. Temperatures have fluctuated from mild spring days of temperatures in the low-eighties to dropping within in a few hours to weather right at the freezing level. So far, in January alone, we have witnessed rain, hail, snow, and severe wind here at CCB.

For example, on January 19, 2021, CCB tenants battened down their aircraft as the weather indicated a Santa Ana condition would bring strong winds to the Airport. While CCB experiences the Santa Ana condition quite often, many times CCB doesn't feel the impact as much as those in neighboring communities. However, on this particular day, CCB experienced just over 12 continuous hours of severe wind. According the automated weather observation system (AWOS), CCB started experiencing steady winds at great than 10 knots (roughly 15 miles per hour) around 11 AM. At 12:10, winds were steady and greater than 15 knots (17 MPH) but less than 20 knots (23 MPH) with occasional gusts to 28 knots (32 MPH). At 12:45, the AWOS recorded its first steady wind at 20 knots or greater. Around 4 PM, winds were recorded consistently at or greater than 20 knots and at times reaching a top speed of 24 knots (28 MPH) with gusts at 33 knots (38 MPH). Winds stayed within this range for over seven (7) hours. At 11:30 PM, the winds started to subside getting back to normal wind levels.

Last increased January 2019

Rent Increase Effective July 1, 2021

Effective July 1st, 2021, all leases that are more than one year old will see a 3% rent increase in accordance with Section 5 of your lease. Cable last adjusted the rental rates in January 2019 and while the lease provisions allow for an annual increase, Airport Management does all it can to keep the increases to a minimum. The new monthly rental rates are as follows:


