Nothing Like Some Crazy Weather!

The end of 2021 and the beginning of 2022 brought CCB some crazy weather in the form of wind and rain. While wind and rain are not uncommon at CCB, the amount of rain dropped within a short amount of time combined with sustained winds that followed a couple of weeks later combined to created quite a bit of havoc in the form of many downed trees in the community surrounding the Airport.

Cable's Automated Weather Observation System (AWOS) recorded a total of 4.2 inches of rain falling on Airport property within a 36 hour stretch which involved two storms. The more-than-usual amount of rain didn't cause CCB many problems other than the standard leaks we normally have with rainfall. We have to consider ourselves lucky as the volume of water was vast. To give you an idea of how vast, consider this: one inch of rain covering one acre is approximately 27,154 gallons of water. When you consider the size of the land that makes up the Airport, approximately 90 acres, and the fact that 4.2 inches of rain fell, this equates to the Airport having had over 10 million

halves come together. No other damage to property occurred in either location. The common denominator on the

gallons of water introduced to the grounds in a very short time. To say

we were lucky is an understatement.

It was a different story when it came to the wind as the sustained winds caused quite a bit a calamity on the Airport grounds in the form of hangar doors coming loose, inadequately secured aircraft being tossed about, and pretty much anything light that wasn't secured is probably not where it originally was. Considering the damage that occurred in the immediate area, CCB faired pretty well.

When it came to damage of Airport property, almost all the damage was focused on the hangar doors as approximately 30 hangars had their doors blown off their tracks in varying levels. The worst cases consisted of a complete door being blown down on a box hangar on the north row and another door buckled in its middle where the two

door damage was all the hangars that experienced damage faced north. Staff speculates the wind blew so hard that it literally lifted the hangar roof enough to pick the doors up off their tracks.

To support that speculation, the AWOS revealed the wind sustained a speed of 20 knots (23 mph) or more for roughly 7 1/2 hours straight. Sustained wind speed increased to 30 knots (35 mph) for about 3 hours within this time frame eventually hitting a sustained wind speed of 40 knots (46 mph) for a short period of time. Wind gusts were recorded up to 57 knots (66 mph) during the periods with increased wind speed.

To conclude, if you are having difficulties opening/closing your doors, call the Airport Office and someone will be dispatched to take care of them.

EAA VMC Club Question of the Month - Answer

The AIM under Section 2, Chapter 3-2-4 Class C Airspace, Subsection C, point 3, note 4 states:

"Class C airspace areas have a procedural Outer Area. Normally this area is 20 NM from the primary Class C airspace airport. (This outer area is not charted.)"

This area is not drawn on the chart but is noted in a magenta box near Class C airspace. The procedure for entering Class C airspace is to contact the approach controller within the procedural area around the airport.
