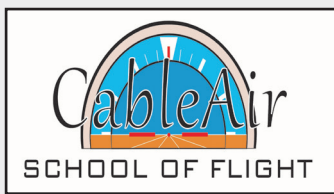

Break Down Those Boxes

It's the holiday season. The Airport has noticed a ton of Amazon boxes plus many others in the recycle bin; Unfortunately, whoever put those boxes in the bins didn't take the time break them down.

Sure, we realize recycling cardboard boxes that haven't been broken down isn't the end of the world; however, there are a few reasons why you should take the little time it takes to break them down. For instance:

- Broken down boxes are easier to manage. Try fitting a number of various size unbroken down cardboard boxes in your vehicle or anywhere else for that matter. Even if you stack them, they become difficult to handle;
- Broken down boxes take up a lot less room. It is estimated ten broken down boxes fit in the space of one assembled box of the same size thus making them easier to store; and
- Broken down boxes are easier to recycle. Because they are easier to manage and take up less room, they are easier to dispose of.

We ask that you keep all the above in mind when disposing of your cardboard. As many have found out, the recycle bin quickly fills up after it is emptied mostly from the space taken up by intact boxes. So be courteous to all of your fellow tenants by taking the time to maximize the space in the recycle bin.



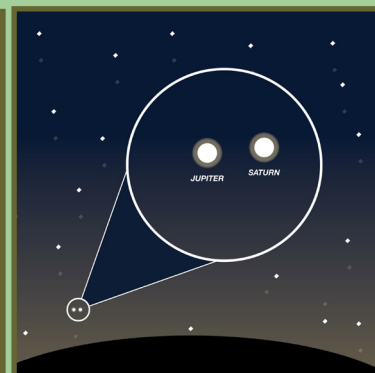

SPOTTED AT CCB: THE GREAT CONJUNCTION

When it became dark on December 21, 2020, the Airport was inundated with folks looking to see an extremely rare celestial event known as the "Great Conjunction".

Jupiter-Saturn conjunctions happen every 20 years; the last one was in the year 2000. But these conjunctions aren't all created equal. The 2020 great conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn will be the closest since 1623 and the closest observable since 1226!
