#### AWOS is there for a reason

#### **CCB Miscellaneous**

On the Monday, the week of December 12th, the Airport Office was hit with three power surges in a row. The result was the loss of some electonic equipment including two items on CCB's AWOS. Staff was able to get the AWOS operational again within a matter of minutes; however, one of the devices that allowed the weather data to be sent outside of the Airport to the different systems that use the weather data such as all the popular flight software. The weather data was still available by radio (119.525) or telephone (909-985-4731).

Due to the holidays, it took a week to get the AWOS repaired and communicating again. Unfortunately, during this period it was noticed how many pilots do not use the AWOS. On multiple occassions the AWOS was reporting measurable wind from the east which favors runway 6 yet runway 24 was getting on the arriving and departing traffic. And we are not talking about a sudden wind change. In fact, it was noticed on a few occassions, airplanes heading to both the 6 and 24 run-up areas.

Moral to the story? Verify your weather observation with what the AWOS is reporting. It may save you from trouble.

### **New Asphalt**

In December, with the help of a couple of minor FAA grants, CCB was able to invest in some much needed asphalt maintenance. The areas completed were the 13th Street west gate entrance up and around the east side of the "triangle" area.

#### No E-waste in Dumpsters

It has been noticed that e-waste is being deposited into our dumpsters. E-waste is strictly prohibited in those containers. If you have e-waste, take it to an e-waste collection center or call the Airport Office to see if they are in the process of collecting e-waste for disposal. Whatever you do, do no utilize CCB trash containers!

#### No Gasoline in Waste Oil Container

The last time CCB had the waste oil container emptied, it was noticed by the recycling company that there were quite a number of gallons of fuel in the waste oil container. Fuel is not allowed in the waste oil container. The waste oil collected is recycled through a reprocessing method used at the refineries. Fuel contanninates the oil making it unusuable. While the recycling company took the waste this time, they put CCB on notice that the next time they will reject to load.

What is the difference between CTAF and UNICOM frequencies? What does a letter C positioned in a blue circle following a CT (control tower) frequency (see the picture to the right) mean?

#### **EAA VMC Club Question of the Month - Answer**

AC 90-42F describes CTAF and UNICOM as:

- a. COMMON TRAFFIC ADVISORY FREQUENCY (CTAF) A designated frequency for the purpose of carrying out airport advisory practices while operating to or from an airport that does not have a control tower or an airport where the control tower is not operational. The CTAF is normally a UNICOM, MULTICOM, flight service station (FSS) frequency, or a tower frequency.
- b. UNICOM A non-government air/ground radio communication station which may provide airport information at public-use airports.

In both cases, the wording "may be" and "is normally" suggests that the CTAF may be a UNICOM, but UNICOM does not have to be CTAF. For example, we should always announce our intentions on CTAF when there is no operating control tower (CT) at the airport. On the other hand, UNICOM frequency will be used to communicate with an FBO or other staffed airport facility other than CT, and it could be different from CTAF.

The circled C symbol next to the control tower frequency of 119.8 means the tower's frequency is the CTAF when the tower is closed.

## CCB Tenant Inducted into EAA Sport Aviation Halls of Fame

On November 11, 2021, CCB tenant Carl Scholl was inducted into the EAA Sport Aviation Halls of Fame. The following is a reprint of the program used for his induction:

### Carl Scholl | Tony Ritzman

EAA 184061, WOA 3049 | EAA 393289, WOA 11703

Carl Scholl and Tony Ritzman were both born in the 1940s and bitten by the aviation bug in their early 30s. Carl came across a derelict B-25 parked at the Ramona Airport in California. Fascinated, he wandered into the FBO and found the owner. Before long, Carl was the proud owner of N3155G - even though he had never flown an aircraft before.

Tony's introduction to aviation came when he visited Carl at his transmission shop and saw him working on a B-25 rudder assembly. Tony was intrigued by the project and offered to buy into it, thus forming their ongoing business venture, Aero Trader. Carl and Tony sought out parts and other airframes to support the restoration. They earned their pilot certificates, and by 1982, they were both type rated in the B-25. A long succession of B-25s began the restoration process under Carl and Tony's care. In 1985, they moved Aero Trader's operations to Chino, California.

Today, Aero Trader is recognized as one of the top warbird restoration operations in the world. Carl and Tony's vision and dedication to the preservation of the B-25 and other warbirds is legendary. There are very few airworthy B-25s in the warbird community that have not been under the care of Carl and Tony - including the EAA's own Berlin Express.
