Airport's New Fuel Truck Has Arrived... Finally!

After almost a year and with plenty of doubts as to whether it was actually going to materialize, on June 17th, CCB took delivery of its new fuel truck. This truck was special ordered from an aviation equipment FBO

located in Houston, Texas.

Based on a used Isuzu commercial vehicle chassis, the fuel truck contains a 600 gallon 100LL fuel tank and all the appropriate gear to safely fuel aircraft.

The next steps are getting the fuel truck certified by the State of California Department of Food and Agriculture Division of Measurement Standards also known as weights and measures, equipping the fuel truck with a remote payment processing system, and adding



accessories needed in the fueling process including a ladder and an emergency spill kit. If all goes well, the fuel truck should be fully operational by the last week of July.

EAA VMC Club Question of the Month - Answer

In many areas, pilots can communicate with an FSS remotely via NAVAID sites such as VORs. For example, in the area of the Okefenokee Swamp, the Macon FSS can be contacted via the WAYCROSS VOR (see above). The "122.1 R" above the VOR box indicates Macon FSS (identified below the VOR box) receives on 122.1 and can respond to calls via the VOR. When making contact, pilots should indicate they are "Listening Waycross," and turn up the volume on their VOR receiver to hear the response.



Lloyd SmithDecember 24, 1931 – June 6, 2022

Tony Gadis Recalls......

I first met Lloyd on March 29, 1984, the day of my CFI practical test with Steve Holmes at the Runway 37 facility at Brackett Airport. At that time, Lloyd was the Flight Manager at both facilities CableAir (CCB) and Runway 37 at POC. After earning my CFI that day, I asked the examiner Mr. Holmes if he knew of any CFI positions that were available. He responded with Lloyd was looking for CFI's. In those days, the two schools had an excess of 35 airplanes between the two of them. Lloyd would shuttle airplanes to Cable for maintenance and then



ride his motorcycle between the two airports on return. So, I drove to Cable after that response and asked him for a job. When I was at Cable, he would be heading back to Brackett. After driving back and forth several times between both facilities I would miss him to only find out he had just left. So, then I finally decided to park myself at Cable and wait for him to show. After a few hours passed, we finally met. After meeting me his initial reaction to my request was that I more than likely would not stay long. At that time my logbook was at 600 hours or so, and the typical new CFIs had about an average of 250 hours or so. I made the promise to Lloyd to stay a minimum of a year, so he decided to hire me and through several airline adventures, I never left.

Lloyd ran a very tight organization, if a CFI or renting pilot stepped over the line, we would incur what we liked to refer to as the wrath of Lloyd, which we all did on occasion. Between Lloyd's input and Paul Cable's temper we learned to function in the environment. Initially my intent was to transfer to Brackett but when an opening came up at Brackett, I chose to stay even though at the time Brackett was closer to my home. Lloyd was also a designated FAA written test examiner, in which he administered tests using the office space above the café that is located right up the stairs. Many of us took the FAA written exams with Lloyd. Lloyd stayed until the closing of Runway 37 at Brackett that was around 2004. Without the need to shuttle aircraft and with the shrinking fleet, he decided it was time. At that time, Lloyd moved away and found a new career driving a bus in Oceanside so that he could obtain health and retirement benefits. Lloyd and I remained friends and communicated regularly over the years. I would update him on the careers of all the CFI's that went on in the aviation industry to work for the airlines and he was proud of us all. I visited with him several time last year at his Oceanside home. Whenever I observe poor pattern discipline, or sloppy instructing, and poor airman-ship, I hear Lloyd's words. No one knew the way between airports better. He made us all better pilots, I will miss him, he was proud Navy Veteran of the Korean War, and he provided many memories for us all.


