Ethan was a child of Cable airport whose journey came to an end far too soon. He came from a family of pilots and from the minute he could talk he was always looking skyward. Indeed, one of his first words was a misconstrued definition of an airplane which flew overhead during an anatomy lesson. To everyone's amusement airplanes would be known by Ethan as 'bo-bos' for several years afterward. He took his very first flight at three weeks old. He was so little he had to sit in his mother Linda's lap as his father Tony flew in the pattern in his 1946 Globe Swift.



Before his first birthday, Ethan went on his first international flight to Australia, and more importantly his first of many visits to the Oshkosh Airshows. As a child growing up, he explored every part of Cable airport by bicycle and scooter with his little sister Jessica. Although he spent countless hours visiting air museums and flying with his family, his favorite time of the year was the Cable Airshow because, to him, Cable was home.

During his sophomore year at Etiwanda High School, he took his first solo flight. After which he volunteered weekly at the Planes of Fame air museum in Chino. There he completed his Boy Scout Eagle Project by creating informational signs for the museum's B17 bomber. Ethan's love of airplanes and flying was only matched by his love of history, especially WW2 history. At the Planes of Fame, he was able to meet many WW2 veterans, air aces and soldiers alike. He loved to listen to them and hear any stories they wished to tell. His family would always say, "He loves old people."

He took the first step in his dream to become an Air Force pilot by joining the Air National Guard in 2011. Until he could finish his history degree from Cal Poly Pomona, he served as a crew chief on F-15's in the 144th Fighter Wing attaining the rank of Staff Sergeant. Several years later as a private pilot on a local flight Ethan experienced an engine failure in his 1946 Luscombe and crash landed. Fourteen surgeries and months of rehabilitation did not deter him from flying again and in 2016 he earned his commercial pilot certificate. Soon he was towing banners all over Southern California as well Nevada and Arizona.



He loved to travel and took great pride in visiting his family's ancestral home in Greece. While not flying, one of his favorite things to do was to barbecue with his friends in his hangar and enjoy the beautiful Cable sunsets. One thing was for sure, Ethan had a memorable smile and a large number of friends whether from flying, shooting, cars or motorcycles. He leaves a large hole in our hearts. Friends of Ethan, please come join us in a celebration of his life on July 24th, 2021, 4:00 pm at Hangar Q.

NOTAM for July 4, 2021

Airport Will Be Closed for Fireworks Display
9:00 pm to 9:45 pm

The City of Upland will be hosting a pandemic friendly "stay-in-place" fireworks show the evening of July 4th. The intent is for residents to be able to see the fireworks display from the comfort of their homes and yards. In order to be able to accomplish something like this, the City of Upland has secured permission from Holliday Rock to house the display. Additionally, they have secured FAA permission to have such a display next to an airport.

As you can see in the aerial photo, the display area is in the north-western portion of the Holliday Rock property. The projectiles will be launched up to 800' AGL in what is basically the crosswind entry to runway 24 or the downwind leg of runway 6.

In order for the projectiles to be launched, CCB will need to briefly close its runways. The pyrotechnics company indicates the actual projectiles will only be fired for 15 to 20 minutes, they have requested the runway be closed for 45 minutes to accommodate any potential delays.

CCB requests that our pilots plan accordingly should there be a desire to go flying that evening.

Last increased January 2019

Rent Increase Effective July 1, 2021

Effective July 1st, 2021, all leases that are more than one year old will see a 3% rent increase in accordance with Section 5 of your lease. Cable last adjusted the rental rates in January 2019 and while the lease provisions allow for an annual increase, Airport Management does all it can to keep the increases to a minimum. The new monthly rental rates are as follows:
