

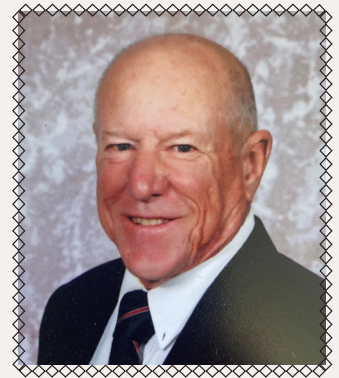


Gone West...

How do airplane flight characteristics change as the CG is moved from a forward position to an aft position?

Question of the Month – Answer

As the CG is moved from a forward to an aft position, less downward force is required on the tail in level flight, and therefore less lift is required. This means the aircraft can cruise at a lower angle of attack and lower power setting, and thus, fuel efficiency is improved. However, the longitudinal stability decreases as the CG moves aft, which decreases the ability of the aircraft to right itself after maneuvering or turbulence. An aft CG means less control force is needed to effect pitch changes (light control forces), making it more difficult to control pitch. An aft CG may also result in more abrupt stall characteristics.

Rent Increase Goes Into Effect July 1, 2024

Effective July 1st, 2024, all leases that are more than one year old will see a 3% rent increase in accordance with Section 5 of your lease. Cable last adjusted the rental rates in November 2022 and while the lease provisions allow for an annual increase, Airport Management does all it can to keep the increases to a minimum. Unfortunately, the circumstances within our current environment have inflated our costs of doing business. Airport Management continues to do its best to get any assistance it can from the FAA to keep CCB rates costs as low as possible. The new monthly rental rates are as follows:

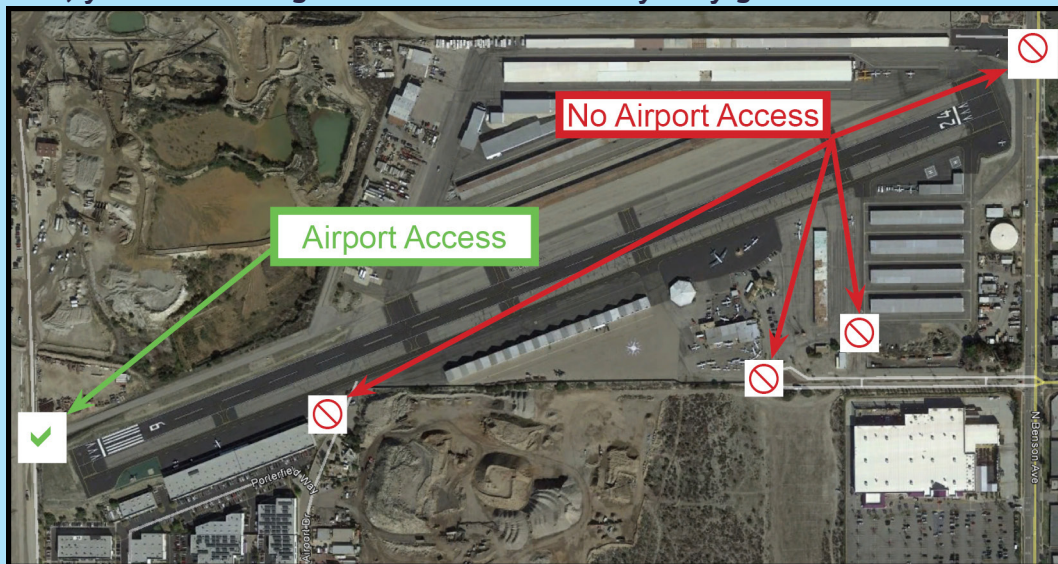

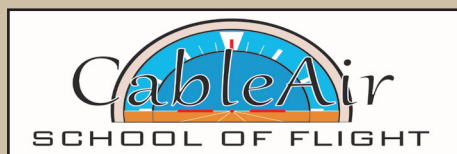
If you have any questions regarding your rent increase please refer to a copy of your lease and/or call us at 909-982-6021 and we will be more than happy to answer your questions.

Hangar Inspections Coming...

As promised, hangar inspections will begin in June. Tenants will be provided a 24 hour notice prior to when your hangar inspection is scheduled. All tenants will receive notification so in the meantime review the *Hangar Fire Inspection Checklist* below to correct any violation that may exist PRIOR to your inspection. Thank you again in advance for your cooperation in the matter.

Hangar Fire Inspection Checklist

1. The fire extinguisher is at least a 2A 10BC rating. Mounted on wall between 3.5 feet to max of 5 feet.
2. The fire extinguisher has been serviced by a State Fire Marshal's licensed company within the past year.
3. There is at least one fire extinguisher inside each Hanger.
4. Electrical panel switches are clearly marked.
5. Provide 3 feet minimum clearance around all electrical panels.
6. All electrical outlets and junction boxes have cover plates on them.
7. Extension cords are not being used for permanent wiring.
8. Multi-plug adapters are equipped with built-in circuit breakers, and cords do not exceed 6 feet in length.
9. There is no storage over 10 gallons of flammable or Combustible liquids and shall be stored in approved liquid storage cabinets. This does not include combustible liquids that are stored in aircraft or vehicle approved fuel tank.
10. All storage is at least 18 inches below sprinkler heads and 24 inches below ceiling in non-sprinklered buildings.
11. Maintain 3 feet minimum clearance for access/use of fire appliance/equipment.
12. No "high piled" storage allowed in Hanger.
13. Housekeeping/Storage – the aircraft operation area and related areas shall be kept free from combustible debris at all times.
14. Illegal tenant improvements must be permitted or removed.
