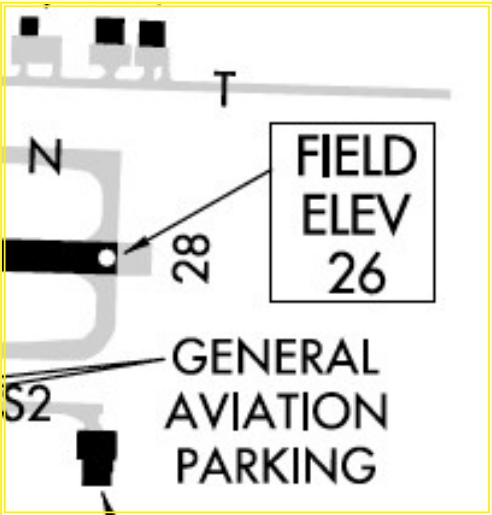

EAA VMC Club Question of the Month – Answer

AGL is the altitude conveyed in the absolute number of feet measured above the ground. If you could take a tape and calculate from the bottom of your airplane to the earth, this would be your elevation above ground level (AGL).

The Field Elevation on the Airport Diagram notes the Airport Elevation. The FAA characterizes the Airport Elevation as the highest point of an airport's usable runways measured in height above mean sea level.

A great deal of aviation symbology and laws have changed to meet the standards of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO). Thus, on VFR charts, you will also see the definition of airport elevation as the highest point on the usable portion of the landing areas.

To give terrain clearance and comply with certain restrictions, you need to know the airport elevation.

- For instance, the maximum speed allowed within four nautical miles or five statute miles of the primary airport of class C airspace is two hundred knots up to two thousand five hundred feet above the primary field elevation.
- You are flying into an airport and entering the traffic pattern 1000 feet above field elevation.
- Another reason you should know the height above the airport is to obey minimum visibility requirements.

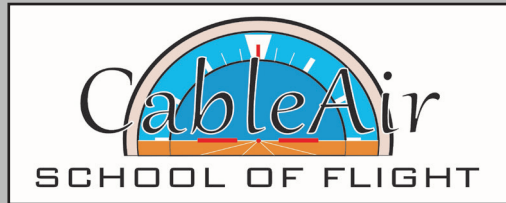
