She then moved to Las Vegas several years ago where she passed away on July 23 after a long battle with cancer. She will be missed by all those that knew her and worked with her. Reggie Webb



A Cableite for over 25 years, Reggie Webb passed away on July 20th 2024 he was 76 years old. Reggie started flying in 1989 after a friend gave him a ride in a Cessna 182 (he was hooked). He then bought into a 182 partnership and later moved into a Piper Comanche 260. But Reggie wanted more speed, efficiency and beauty in the airplane he owned, so he purchased a partially built Lancair in 2005. With the help of Lancair builder Roger Huffman, they completed the Lancair in 2007 and it was everything he hoped it would be. He was also a member of the California Redtails. In 1985 Reggie became a McDonald's franchisee purchasing two restaurants in Pomona. His company grew to operate 16 locations in the Inland Empire by the time Reggie retired in May 2021. Reggie served on numerous Boards of Directors throughout his illustrious career, including the Los Angeles Urban League, Pomona Valley Hospital and the Los Angeles County Fair. In 2004 he received the prestigious 365Black award from McDonald's honoring his commitment to strengthening African American communities. An advocate for higher education, Reggie encouraged his children to earn degrees before joining the family business. He joined the University of La Verne Board of Trustees in 2014, actively working on finance committees, generously supported scholarships, and taking time to mentor through campus African American organizations.



The founder of Webb Family Enterprises Inc, built a legacy of transforming lives and uplifting communities he served, particularly through social equity enterprises. His dedication to education, charitable outreach, health, business, and social justice has left a lasting impact.

Reggie was a beacon of strength, a loving husband, father, and a true leader. His life was a testament to the power of love and the impact one person can have on so many. This family stated "Reggie believed in the power of unity and the importance of speaking life into people, always encouraging those around him".

Reggie is survived by his beloved wife of more the 50 years, Rene Webb; his three children; eight grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren. Fly West Reggie! you will be missed.

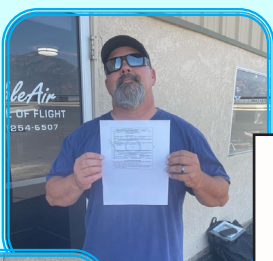

Question of the Month – Answer

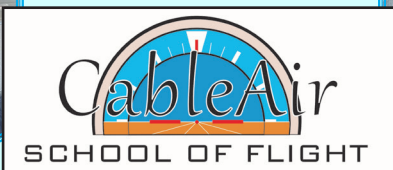
According to FAA Team Notice NOTC3401, no FAA approval is required to modify or customize a checklist, at least for those of us operating under Part 91. However, it recommends that aircraft owners start by consulting their aircraft's POH, AFM, or panel placards in some older aircraft. A general rule promoted by some flight instructors is that it is permissible to add items to the manufacturer's checklist. However, nothing should be omitted. One should also note that when taking a checkride for a pilot certificate or rating, the Designated Pilot Examiner may request justification for changes made to the checklist being used and may wish to verify its validity.

For checklists used in Part 135 or Part 121 operations, FAA approval of checklists is required. FAA Order 8900.1, Volume 3, Chapter 32, Section 12, contains the guidance that FAA inspectors use when accepting or approving checklists for Part 121 and 135 operators.
