Celebrate World's Pilot Day on April 26th, 2025

The role of pilots, including commercial pilots, flight instructors, private flight crew, fighter jet pilots and recreational pilots, is recognized across the globe during World's or also referred to as International Pilots' Day, which takes place on April 26th each year.

The association selected April 26th to highlight the inaugural flight of the first Turkish pilot, Mehmet Fesa Evrensev, who had played a significant role in the development of Turkish aviation since the early 1910s.

The idea to turn April 26th into an international celebration was further established by the International Federation of Air Line Pilots' Associations (IFALPA). The organization, based in Canada and formed in 1948 to merge various pilot associations into a single unit, currently represents the interests of more than 140,000 pilots worldwide.

In 2013, IFALPA initiated negotiations to establish a specific date to celebrate Pilots' Day.

As TALPA had been the first to celebrate April 26th in honor of Fesa Evrensev's first flight, IFALPA saw the date and its ties with a prominent piloting figure as an opportunity to recognize the work of all pilots across the globe. The following year, on April 26th, 2014, International Pilots' Day was celebrated for the first time.

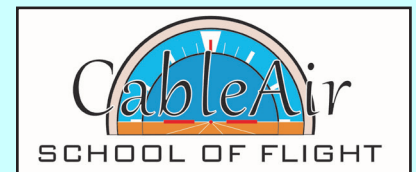

Pyrotechnic Signaling Devices (e.g., flares, flare guns) are often carried on general aviation aircraft to be used in emergencies. However, these can also pose a hazard when the aircraft is in flight. Does the FAA provide guidance regarding precautions to be taken to reduce the safety risks?

Question of the Month – Answer

Yes. According to AC 91.58A, Use of Pyrotechnic Visual Distress Signaling Devices in Aviation, paragraph 7, "HANDLING AND STORAGE. a. If young children are carried on board your aircraft, careful stowage of visual distress signals becomes especially important. Projected devices, such as pistol-launched and hand-held parachute flares and meteors, have many of the characteristics of a firearm and should be handled with the same caution.

b. Pyrotechnic devices should be stored in a cool, dry location and be readily accessible in case of an emergency. Care should be taken to prevent puncturing or damaging of the device's covering. It is recommended that pyrotechnic devices be stored in a watertight container and prominently marked "DISTRESS SIGNALS."

c. U.S. Coast Guard-approved pyrotechnic devices carry a service life expiration date. Currently, this date may not exceed 42 months from the date of manufacture. The U.S. Coast Guard indicates that it is acceptable to keep recently expired signals as extra equipment, although they gradually lose their effectiveness with age.
