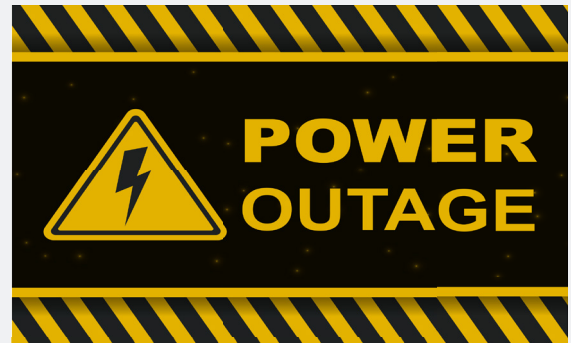

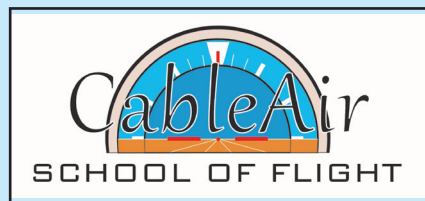

5. Multiple real world missions were supported with a list hiker, Udf and radio comms.

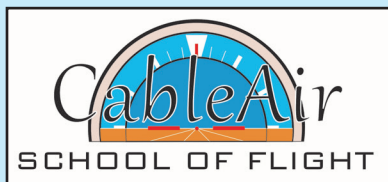


Some promotions and personnel changes were made as well addition of a senior member.

Question of the Month

You're flying on a hot, summer day. The outside air temperature is 100 degrees, but fortunately, the relative humidity is only about 30 percent. In these conditions, should carburetor icing be a concern?

Question of the Month – Answer

Yes! According to FAA Special Airworthiness Information Briefing (SAIB) CE-09-35, formation of carburetor icing under these conditions is a possibility. According to this document, 212 accidents attributed to carburetor icing were reported between 1998 and 2007. Of these accidents, 13 resulted in fatalities. This bulletin also provides the following advisories regarding safe operation:

To prevent carburetor icing, the pilot should:

- **Assure the proper functionality of the carburetor heat during the ground (Before Takeoff) check.**
- **Use carburetor heat on approach and descent when operating at low power settings, or in conditions where carburetor icing is probable.**

To recognize carburetor icing, the warning signs are:

- **A drop in rpm in fixed pitch propeller airplanes.**
- **A drop in manifold pressure in constant-speed propeller airplanes.**
- **In both types, usually there will be a roughness in engine operation.**

The pilot should respond to carburetor icing by applying full carburetor heat immediately. The engine may run rough initially for a short time while ice melts. The above recommendations are general suggestions. The pilot should consult the AFM or the pilot's operating handbook for the proper use of carburetor heat.
