# FLY CA PASSPORT



So what is Fly CA Passport? The program celebrates the fun, freedom, and adventure of flying to 239 public airports across California. Founded in September 2025, this program is currently in their grassroots phase, building a program that supports general aviation airports, local businesses within the aviation community.

The Fly California Passport Program is designed by the community, for the community, to ensure its long-term

success. The goal of the program is to give pilots an exciting reason to fly, beyond the typical “\$150 hamburger,” while boosting aviation-related economic activity and helping keep California’s public airports open by encouraging visits to destinations throughout the state.

### **How to Participate**

To join the Fly California Passport Program, you’ll need an official Fly CA Passport book. This book will be used to collect stamps at each airport you visit. The program is open to everyone: student pilots, private pilots, commercial pilots, aviation enthusiasts, and even visitors from outside California but it is now available here at Cable. You will find a Fly CA Passport station located at the Fuel Island. There will be a sign to direct you where you will be able to find the stamp for your passport. **Question of the Month**

**What is a "LAHSO" clearance, and can a pilot decline it?**

*(Keep reading for the answer below!)*

Whether you're a seasoned pilot, a student working on your license, or someone who just loves watching airplanes, EAA Chapter 448 welcomes you. **Question of the Month – Answer**

**LAHSO stands for Land and Hold Short Operations. It's an ATC clearance that authorizes a pilot to land on a runway but requires them to stop before reaching an intersecting runway, taxiway, or other designated point. LAHSO is used at airports where runway intersections exist and simultaneous operations on crossing runways increase capacity.**

**According to the AIM (Section 4-3-11): "LAHSO is an ATC procedure that requires pilot participation to balance the needs for increased airport capacity and safety." The clearance includes the available landing distance (ALD), which is published in the Airport/Facility Directory (Chart Supplement). The pilot must confirm that their aircraft can safely stop within the ALD before accepting.**

**The critical point: A pilot can always decline a LAHSO clearance — and should if there's any doubt about stopping distance, especially considering runway conditions, aircraft weight, or weather. Student pilots are not authorized to participate in LAHSO. The PIC simply responds "Unable" to ATC, and they'll make other arrangements. There's no penalty for declining.**
