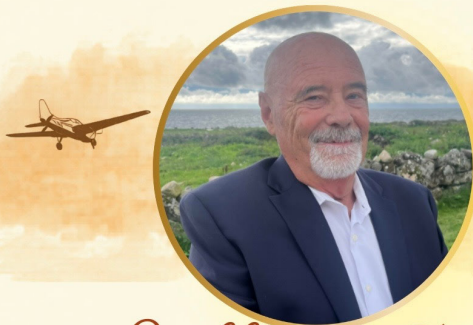

Question of the Month

You are approaching for landing on runway 32 at a large and busy airport that has inbound regional airline traffic landing on 36. While on final, the tower requests you to Land and Hold Short of runway 36 for landing traffic. This reduces your available landing distance on 32 to 2,000 feet. Are you required to accept the land and hold short request? Why should or shouldn't you accept, and what are the potential consequences of accepting or declining the request?

Question of the Month – Answer

As PIC, the decision to accept the request is yours alone; you are not required to accept. If you accept the request and overrun the intersection, the incursion could result in a collision with the other aircraft, or at least a violation. On the other hand, you can simply state that you are "unable" if you are not positive you can actually land and stop before the runway intersection. If you decline, the controller will likely keep you in the pattern until you can be safely sequenced in with the other traffic. Most importantly, set an honest personal minimum: if the numbers don't leave margin over the terrain or obstacles off the departure end, the right call is to wait for cooler air. An early-morning departure is almost always safer than a mid-afternoon one in a Southern California summer.

Wash Rack Use Policy

Authorized uses for the wash rack include washing airplanes, passenger vehicles and motorhomes

The following activities are prohibited in the wash rack:

- ☐ Degreasing engines or mechanical components
- ☐ Washing or rinsing construction vehicles, equipment, or trailers contaminated with dirt, mud, or other debris
- ☐ Removing mud from off-road vehicles
- ☐ Any activity that may introduce excessive sediment, oil, grease, chemicals, or other contaminants into the wash rack drainage system

Users are responsible for ensuring that all washing activities comply with facility requirements

The wash rack is provided as a courtesy. Please help keep it clean and usable for everyone!

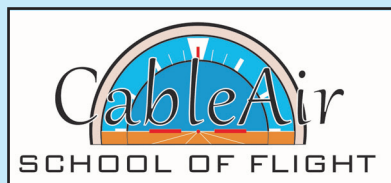
