We aren't looking for a professionally produced video or the applicant with the most followers. We're looking for a serious student who understands the opportunity, has done the research, and can make a strong case for how they would use it.

During flight, you notice an anomaly with the electrical system; the ammeter and battery voltage indicate a discharge. What steps can you take to restore or prolong electrical power as you navigate to an available airport?

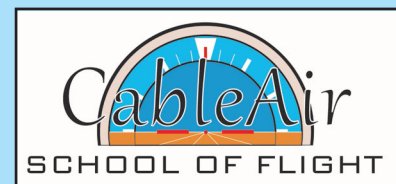
Question of the Month – Answer

The first step is to follow the checklist for the abnormal condition. If the aircraft manual does not provide a checklist for this situation, consider the following:

1. Verify that the alternator switch is turned on.
2. If the switch is on, turn it off, wait a few seconds, and then turn it back on. If this doesn't resolve the problem, continue the steps below.
3. Check the circuit breakers for open circuits.
4. If the problem is not resolved, continue to the nearest available airport.
5. Turn off any unnecessary electrical items to conserve remaining battery power for essential navigation, communication, and gear and flap operation.
6. If on a flight plan or if using ATC flight following, advise ATC of your situation and request a diversion and any other required assistance. If not, contact the local area ATC and advise them of your situation and any request(s) you might have.

Once again, your Civil Air Patrol team at Cable Composite Squadron 25 has been busy serving our community, supporting missions, and developing the next generation of aviation leaders.

Our recent operational activities have included supporting U.S. Marine Corps Marine Expeditionary Unit evaluations in several roles, including simulated aircraft support, airborne photography, and fire-support missions. Squadron members have also provided drone support for wildfire operations in Washington State.

Closer to home, our members have participated in three recent ELT/EPIRB search missions, including one mission in the San Diego area. These missions provide valuable opportunities for our members to use their training while supporting Civil Air Patrol's emergency services mission.
